



BBC Radio Leicester were celebrating their 40th birthday year and for this, they decide to raise money for their charity of the year - the Rainbows Hospice. They wanted to put on a show that toured four venues around Leicestershire and used local talent from amateur groups. The groups would sing forty songs from forty shows. The organisers approached LIVE LX for help with designing the lighting for the show and we were more than happy to help. The main problem was creating a design that would fit in to the venues with



minimal set up time, without losing the big production feel. The load in started at 9am and the cast would be on stage from lunchtime, leaving a short time to rig and focus lights. This problem was overcome by the use of moving lights as the main base of the rig, which would tour with the show leaving minimal local kit for the venues to supply. We supplied them with eight Clay Paky Alpha spots and 6 Mac 250s, as well as a star cloth and a haze machine. Along with the lighting design, we also supplied a technician to help set up and de rig at each venue. The producers were extremely happy with the results, as were all the venues that the show toured in to. The show was a great success and raised thousands of pounds for charity.
